CONSIDERATION OF DESIGNATING ST.  
JOSEPH ACADEMY AS A LOCAL HISTORIC  
LANDMARK.

WHEREAS, St. Joseph's Academy is an outstanding example of the historic revival styles that dominated the architecture of institutional buildings during the first half of the 20<sup>th</sup> century; and

WHEREAS, St. Joseph's Academy is unusual and significant in this regard, because of its use of a French neo-classical design; and

WHEREAS, St. Joseph's Academy is also significant for the presence of the sisters of St. Joseph of Medaille in the Baton Rouge community since 1868 and the presence of St. Joseph's Academy in its current location on Broussard Street since 1940.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Metropolitan Council of the City of Baton Rouge and Parish of East Baton Rouge, that St. Joseph's Academy, located at 3015 Broussard Street, being more particularly described as follows: bordered on the north by Kleinert Avenue, on the south by Broussard Street, on the east by Parker Street, and on the west by Lot 1-X, 59' portion of Lot 1, A, B, 55' portion of Lot 1, 1-A, 1-B, 1-C, 160' portion of Lot 1, and currently owned by the Sisters of Saint Joseph of Medaille, is hereby designated a Local Historic Landmark under the provisions of Title 7, Chapter, 3, Section 3.5 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Baton Rouge and Parish of East Baton Rouge.
